WHAT MADE YOU APPLY FOR AN APPRENTICESHIP ROLE?

I joined the council in September 2020. I chose to go down the apprenticeship route as it allows you to work whilst gaining a qualification. I am a school leaver and university didn't seem like the right choice for me at that point in my life. As an apprentice, I spend four months with different departments learning and gaining as much knowledge from each department as I can. So by the end of my apprenticeship I should know the inner workings of multiple departments. I have just finished my first placement and am onto my second one.

HOW DO YOU BALANCE WORK AND STUDY AT THE SAME TIME?

With the apprenticeship you also get to do a qualification, I am doing my CIH level 3. So far I have done one assignment. Doing this qualification you get 20% of your work-time to complete it. I take every Monday as my study day as this has been plenty of time to complete the assignments. I have a great tutor who has really helped me in finding my feet with these assignments. I can use my everyday work as part of my evidence for my qualification which is great!

DO YOU HAVE ANY ADVICE TO OFFER ANYONE CONSIDERING AN APPRENTICESHIP ROLE IN LOCAL GOVERNMENT?

I thoroughly enjoy working at Stevenage Borough Council and I can't wait for the next year of my apprenticeship. If I had any advice for someone deciding whether to do an apprenticeship or not I would say just go for it! University isn't for everyone and many people feel that it is the only route you can go down, as I used to feel the same, but an apprenticeship is a great alternative! In terms of the future honestly, I don't know where I want to go, but then at this age, many people don't. All I know this that the skills I am learning in my apprenticeship will help me wherever I end up!
