My name is Samuel Mann, and I am currently the Building Control apprentice for Basildon Borough Council.

### What made you apply for an apprenticeship role?

I joined the council back in September 2019 just coming out of secondary school, not knowing what path I wanted to take in life. I knew I didn't want to go to college and wanted to get straight into work however I was unsure on what I really wanted to do. The apprenticeship role really gained my interest as I knew I would still gain plenty of knowledge and qualifications whilst getting paid which was ideal for what I was looking for. My current apprenticeship was mentioned to me, and I also see it on social media, so I gave it a shot and went for it.

#### How have you found the experience of being an apprentice in local government?
