My name is Connor Graham and I work at Basildon Borough Council as a Greens Keeper. I joined the council in September 2019.

Why did you choose an apprenticeship?

I applied for the apprenticeship roles because I wanted to gain knowledge while acquiring skills and experience in the working environment which would help me develop practical skills that were needed for the role. I was introduced to this through family members, my brother also completed the same apprenticeship many years ago and recommended it to me and he has since progressed. I was working for the NHS before I started my apprenticeship.

How have you found the experience of being an apprentice in local government?
