Peer Leadership Development Programme What is the Peer Leadership Development Programme?

England

- The programme has three main aims:
- To tell people what personalised care is and how it can help them to self-manage their health condition
- To enable people to develop the knowledge, skills and confidence to support others e.g. through offering peer support
- To develop Peer Leaders and achieve an ambition of developing 500 Peer Leaders by 2024

What is a Peer Leader?

A person with lived experience who is committed to working collaboratively with the health and care system to provide leadership and empowerment for strategic coproduction, peer support and self-management education.





Who is it for?

The Peer Leadership Development Programme is mainly **England** aimed at people who could benefit from personalised care, for example:

- Disabled people
- People who have a long-term health condition and/or
- Their family carer
- People who could benefit from personalised care at a particular time in their life, for example, when having a baby

The programme is rooted in the perspective of people with relevant lived experience of personalised care, so their voices and reflections are woven throughout.

The Peer Leadership Development Programme is a personal development programme, rather than a training programme

- It runs continuously so people can join at any time
