
General feedback from people at the 2022/23 event -what's going well and not so well from 2022

What worked well?

- Sitting services have been available
- Services that are not just Monday to Friday 9-5 (needs to continue)
- There was more support in relation to mental health but for the person being looked after
- Information and support from local carers organisations was good varied online support
- Good connections and information during the pandemic
- Peer support a lifeline

What could be even more effective?

- Not enough Mental Health Support for Carers
- Services were not available for the full range of ages people can fall through the net if they don't fit
- More support and investment needed from councils into local voluntary services
- Good balance between virtual and in person support required
- More advice post college/prior to work
- Early identification of carers and delivery of personalised accessible information as soon as possible



What have we been focusing on in 2023?

- New chair of the carers network commenced in June 2023
- Meetings generally every 6-8 weeks
- Well attended by regional leads and representation from Carers Organisations, Carers and health partners
- Continue to learn from data and influence national collections/reports
- Continue to share practice and learn from one another in relation to CQC assurance and improving support to unpaid carers - <u>See here</u>
- Understanding and responding to "No Wrong Doors" supporting younger carers
- Joining up work on transitions from Children's to Adult social care learning from the Carers Trust and regional SEND work – more to do
- Learn from the yearly regional challenge event No significant issues raised this year
- Focus on listening and responding to people (Co-production)
